## **REFLECTION:**

In the Gospel of St John, the term 'Spirit of truth' that the Father gives us, will help us in our Christian life to discern that our true satisfictation in life lies in Jesus himself and being faithful to him. We must not forget the love he has always had for us.

In John's gospel the word 'world' would mean all that opposes God and distracts us in Christian life from following God. St John gives us the differences of those who follow Christ and the world. The faithful disciples of Christ see Jesus and the 'Spirit of truth'. Christ invites his disciples to love one another as he did. As God's baptized children we are called to make his love visible by the witness of our lives so that others may see Jesus living in us and come to know Him. What kind of life we would like to live – the one offered by the world or one offered by Christ, a life of love?

The first reading reminds us that our Christian life should be lived with power and conviction. While we sing, praise and thank God for his redemptive acts let us also like the psalmist, proclaim the 'tremendous deed', the gift of the Spirit that has been poured in our hearts. Through our words and actions it flows out into the world. Let us pause and reflect how we can be obedient and faithful to Christ's commands by loving others as He did; (pause). Let us pray that we may live a Christian life led by the Holy Spirit who inspires others in the world to lead a Christ-centred life. (Pause).

**Leader:** Heavenly Father, you gave us the gift of your Holy Spirit who dwells within us. Hear our prayers and in your grace renew and strengthen us to keep Jesus's commandments and come to know you now and forever. Amen.

Let us together at the Saviour's command and formed by Divine teaching, dare to say: (All say the Lord's Prayer together) Our Father, ...
