**SECOND READING:** Rom 11:13-15, 29-32

**GOSPEL:** Mt 15:21-28

## **REFLECTION:**

In our lives, all of us would have struggled with prayer. We are told by our spiritual guides to always be persistent in prayer, good works and always try to maintain spiritual discipline.

In the first reading, we see that God's blessings and salvation are for all. Isaiah envisions that in the future, all people will be drawn together to worship God "... *a house of prayer for all the people*". The responsorial psalm also invites all people to worship God, who is ruler of the whole earth, and to experience His salvation. The Lord invites us to act with integrity i.e. to do what is right and just. Where is justice lacking today in my family, community and nation? Let us pray that we be open to the Spirit's promptings in our life. **Pause.**

Today's gospel highlights faith and homage in the ministry of Jesus, as a foreign woman approaches him with great faith to seek healing for her daughter. The Canaanite woman in the Gospel refuses to go away even when the disciples try to dismiss her and Jesus speaks harshly to her. Her daughter is '*tormented by a devil*'. She allows nothing to get in her way that can prevent her from getting her daughter healed by Jesus. Touched by her faith, Jesus grants her request. She teaches us to have faith and to be persistent and single-minded. Similarly, we also must be strong in our faith to overcome obstacles like self centeredness, consumerism, false expectations and hopes that mislead us etc... Keeping our eyes on Jesus, can we allow the Holy Spirit to work in our lives to bear fruit and bring healing to others? **Pause.**

## **PRAYER OF THE FAITHFUL**

**Leader:** Having persistence in prayer and faith let us confidently bring our prayers to the Lord.  
**Our response is: Loving Father, hear our prayer**

We pray for all the members of the Church, that we may grow in faith, hope and love; (**pause**); let us pray to the Lord...

We pray for all the people in the world, that guided by the Spirit we may share the earth's resources with all in need; (**pause**); let us pray to the Lord...

We pray for all those who have lost hope, that we may keep our focus on Jesus and be persevering in prayer; (**pause**); let us pray to the Lord...

We pray for all those baptised, that we may place our complete trust in Jesus, who is the source of all healing and life; (**pause**); let us pray to the Lord...

**Leader:** Heavenly Father, You desire that all people be saved through the redemptive work of your Son Jesus. Hear our prayers, that we may grow in faith as communities of love that welcome all, in Your Son Jesus' name. Amen.

Let us together at the Saviour's command and formed by Divine teaching, dare to say:  
(*All say the Lord's Prayer together*) Our Father...

## **CLOSING PRAYER**

O Lord, You made us partakers of Christ through Your Son. We humbly implore Your mercy, that, conformed to His image on earth, we may merit also to be His coheirs in heaven. Who lives and reigns forever and ever. Amen.
