SECOND READING: 1 Thes 5:1-6

GOSPEL: Mt 25:14-30

REFLECTION:

Today, we celebrate World Communications Day in our Archdiocese. We are called to strengthen relationships with God, the members of our family, neighbourhood and society at large. Since the pandemic has brought about physical social distancing and we are not able to visit our loved ones and friends like before, this is a good opportunity to make use of other constructive forms of communication, especially telecommunication, internet and social media, to connect and share the message of God's love with the people who are lost, lonely, away from their families, those affected or suffering due to the pandemic. Is there someone whom I can re-connect with today? **Pause**

The first reading extols the virtues of an ideal and exemplary woman and a perfect wife, leading to a successful relationship between husband and wife and a happy, stable marriage. The woman, precious and capable, hardworking, strong and wise, enriches the lives of those around her and finds fulfilment in her family while also reaching out to the poor and needy. God does not expect us to be perfect but he gives us the grace to work towards achieving these virtues. In what areas can I try to better myself to make myself worthy of God's grace? **Pause**

Similarly, today's Psalm, also called "A Song of Ascents" focuses on God's design for building the ideal home and family. When we obey God's commands and walk in His ways, we are blessed with a happy and prosperous home and family life. Am I following God's blueprint to build a strong foundation for my home and family? **Pause**

The Gospel passage from Matthew reminds us that God has blessed each of us with numerous gifts and talents expecting us to use them well for the glory of His kingdom and in the service of others. God wants us to invest our skills and abilities, our wealth and resources to make an active and positive contribution in serving the Kingdom of Heaven; only then can we be called His "good and faithful servants." Which of my talents are still lying buried which I can unearth and use for God's kingdom? **Pause**

PRAYER OF THE FAITHFUL

Leader: Heavenly Father, you have blessed us with an abundance of graces to become good and faithful servants. With confidence, we bring our prayers before You.

Our response is: Lord, hear our prayer

We pray for all the members of the Church, that we may use our God-given talents for the glory of God's kingdom and in the service of others; **pause**; let us pray to the Lord...

We pray for all those in authority, that they may invest their skills and resources to make a positive contribution to the economy and the people under their care; **pause**; let us pray to the Lord

We pray for the sick, the aged, the lonely and the homebound, that their loved ones and community members may reach out to them and enrich their lives; **pause**; let us pray to the Lord...

We pray for all those baptised, that we may communicate positively with those around us and that those working in Media and Communications will do so with honesty and integrity; **pause**; let us pray to the Lord...

Leader: God our Father, hear the prayers we have place before you and help us to live our lives faithfully, always following your commands and walking in your ways. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Let us together at the Saviour's command and formed by Divine teaching, dare to say: (All say the Lord's Prayer together) Our Father...

CLOSING PRAYER

O Lord, we have partaken in the Celebration of Your Word, humbly imploring that what Your Son commanded us to do. May it bring us growth in charity. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
