

# 24 JANUARY 2021 THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME & SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD

### **INTRODUCTION:**

Pope Francis has instituted the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time as the "Sunday of the Word of God" with the intention that it be a day dedicated to the celebration, reflection and spreading of the Word of God. It reminds us of the richness of Sacred Scripture and how essential it is to our identity as Christians since God is in constant dialogue with His people through His Word and it also forms a bond of unity between all the faithful who listen to it.

# INTRODUCTION TO THE READINGS:

In the first reading, a call to repentance is delivered to the people of Nineveh by Jonah. He asks them to make a radical change in how they live their lives. In the Gospel of today, Jesus makes the same demand. "Repent, and believe in the gospel". In the Psalm, we pray that we may be ready to hear, learn and be faithful to the ways of the Lord and not get engrossed with things in the world. For us as Christians, conversion of life is an on-going process throughout our whole life.
