- 4. We pray for all of us in the Eucharistic assembly that we may adhere always to the Death-Resurrection Mystery of Christ and experience forgiveness of sins through the Sacrament of Reconciliation (pause); we pray to the Lord....

CEL: God Our Father, Your Son Jesus risen from the dead, reveals to us the mysteries of the resurrection. Grant that sharing in his Paschal Mystery, we may become genuine witnesses of His Kingdom. We make this prayer through Christ Our Lord.
