INTRODUCTION:

PRAYER OF THE FAITHFUL:

CELEBRANT: God who raised Jesus from the dead is always listening to our prayers. As we surrender our needs to Him our response is: **GRACIOUS LORD, HEAR OUR PRAYER**

- 1. That the Holy Father, the Bishops, Priests and Religious may exercise the role of the Good Shepherd in their responsibilities as leaders of the Church... we pray to the Lord...
- 2. That our political leaders may be kind and compassionate in reaching out to the vulnerable, the poor, the suffering and those struggling to enjoy the basic necessities of life... we pray to the Lord...
- 3. That each one of us may be guided by the voice of the Good Shepherd as we celebrate his presence in our lives as peacemaker, healer and reconciler... we pray to the Lord...
- 4. That in the given circumstances we face because of the pandemic, all fears and anxieties will be managed with available vaccines and medicines, facilities for quarantine and efficient medical staff... we pray to the Lord...
- 5. That God may listen to the prayers we make with faith in His generous love... (*pause for 7 seconds*) ... we pray to the Lord...

CELEBRANT: Good Shepherd, we thank You for your care for us at all times and for listening to the prayers we make with faith in You and in Your Son Jesus who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God forever and ever. Amen.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF FROM THE CORONA VIRUS:
