



## CHRISTMAS NOVENA

19<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER

**INTRODUCTION:** Dear Friends, on this fourth day of the Novena in preparation for Christmas, we ponder on God's inscrutable plan in the lives of an elderly couple Zechariah and Elizabeth and their son John, the precursor of Jesus, the one who was to make straight the path for a Messiah who would usher in a new creation transformed by his reign of love and peace.

**SCRIPTURE:** Lk 1: 57– 64. (Birth of John the Baptist)

**REFLECTION:** Zechariah and Elizabeth were very much people of tradition, yet they were able to turn aside from the practiced and the usual to follow the prompting of God. As I bring my life before God I ask that I may recognise where my habits have dulled my awareness of God's prompting.

**INTERCESSIONS:** Let us pray to God our Father, who from of old has called his people to salvation through the voice of his prophets:

**Response:** Come Lord, do not delay!

1. 'John' in Hebrew means "God's grace" John is graced by God and is also an instrument of God's grace. May our lives too, be a blessing to someone in some way. **R/-**
2. John leaped for joy in the womb of Elizabeth as she met your expectant mother: Let the world welcome your coming with joy. **R/-**
3. God our Father, John the Baptist recognised Jesus as the Lamb of God; through us, let the world recognise your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. **R/-**
4. John the Baptist lived what he preached in his life: Give us the courage to stand for the truth and to live our convictions. **R/-**
5. We pray for all our modern-day prophets who are the voice of the conscience in our corrupt world. **R/-**

**CONCLUDING PRAYER:** O Root of Jesse, who stands for an ensign of the people, before whom kings shall keep silence and unto whom the Gentiles shall make supplication: Come to deliver us, and tarry not. Amen.
