Let us listen to a reading from the Gospel according to Saint Luke chapter 17 verses 11-19

READING: Luke 17:11-19

Jesus Heals Ten Men With Leprosy (NIV)

Now on his way to Jerusalem, Jesus travelled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he was going into a village, ten men who had leprosy met him. They stood at a distance and called out in a loud voice, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us!"

When he saw them, he said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed.

One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him—and he was a Samaritan. Jesus asked, "Were not all ten

cleansed? Where are the other nine? Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?" Then he said to him, "Rise and go; your faith has made you well."

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ.

REFLECTION: The parable of the lepers teaches us an attitude of gratitude. We know that ten were healed but only one among them returned to say thank you.

Today, let us focus on the other nine.

- They too, might have been very excited that they were healed.
- May be they wanted to first confirm the healing before believing.
- They could not agree on one thing: should they return to Jesus to thank him now or later.
- They may have also felt that they are Jews, they deserved this favour.
- May be they must have thought, once their healing is completely confirmed, then they will return to thank Jesus.
- May be after getting their certification from the priests and acceptance by the community, they must have got so dazzled with the beauty of being welcomed, that they forgot about the one who had cured them.

Just like the lepers we too go through various upheavals in life. Each one of us has our own cross to be carried in our journey of life. When we look back in the year gone by, we see how in different ways, the Lord has had mercy on us and blessed us every moment. His presence has brought a change in our existing circumstances. Probably, there may have been many times that God has shown his mercy to us and we have failed to recognize it and give him glory. There may have been times when we felt hopeless and given up completely but God's hand of protection helped us sail through. We may have never felt his presence but He was there.

Often, we are no better than the nine lepers. We forget to acknowledge our creator, our Saviour, our loving and merciful God. We are obliged to God for our life and all the good things we enjoy in our life including our spiritual life. It is not only when we experience a big healing or miracle that we need to express our thanks, but also, during the small moments of joy and happiness we experience.

We have so much to thank and praise God for but we must have ignored and moved on. Now is the time to thank him for all those blessings that we have experienced throughout the year in every smallest possible way.

Let us take a moment to recall all those times when we have experienced the presence of God in our life and say Thank you Jesus.

Let us now reflect on the motto of Blessed Carlos Acutis's life and try to direct our year 2022 on his life paths.

REFLECTION BASED ON BLESSED CARLOS'S LIFE:

Blessed Carlos Acutis welcomed and loved Jesus as a friend, while still living deeply immersed in the world of today, mastering computer programming, film editing, website creation, and even editing comics by the age of 15. Despite being immersed in media so filled with temptation, the Gospel thrived at his touch and to such an extent that he will probably become the Patron of the Internet.

Blessed Carlos said <u>"To always be close to Jesus, that's my life plan."</u> He maintained his curiosity without succumbing to mainstream interests: "All people are born as originals but many die as photocopies." To move towards this destination and not "die as photocopies," <u>Carlo said that our compass has to be the Word of God.</u> The Eucharist was his true north. Carlo put the Sacrament of the Eucharist at the center of his life and he called it "my highway to heaven." Holiness was its true goal, but not just for him alone. <u>To all, he gave his toolkit for sainthood: daily Mass, Communion, Rosary, Scripture, Eucharistic adoration, weekly Confession, and the willingness to give up something for others.</u> He said "Our aim has to be the infinite and not the finite. The Infinite is our homeland. We have always been expected in Heaven."

Can we make the motto of Blessed Carlos Acutis's life as our motto too for our future? **PAUSE**

Can we set a goal of Holiness for our life in the year 2022?

We do not know what is in store for us in the future but participating in the Holy Eucharist gives us the grace to stand firm. As Blessed Carlos said "If we get in front of the sun, we get sun tans ... but when we get in front of Jesus in the Eucharist, we become Saints."

Can we strive to become saints and start our journey today towards sainthood, leaving behind our past and starting anew.

As we take this first step towards being here today to pray and start the new year, let us put conscious efforts to sustain it to grow more closer to God in the year to come and the years thereafter.
