INTRODUCTION:

Dear friends, in the Eucharistic adoration, we are invited to enter into sacred communion with God in the quiet seclusion of our hearts. Adoration is the creature's highest act of worship given to God, what belongs to him alone. Let us spend some moments of silence, allowing the all-pervading presence of the Lord to envelop our entire being. When the disciples of John the Baptist asked Jesus, "Rabi where do you live?" Jesus did not give the address or any impressive information about Him but said, "Come and see" They visited and stayed with him and found what their hearts and souls truly sought after, and they became his disciples for life. At the beginning of the New Year 2022, Let us examine and know what our hearts seek from our encounter with the Lord.

(Silence)

At this first week of the New Year, whether we leave behind a year of joy or of trials and difficulties, we pause to give thanks.Thank God for the people, the situations and opportunities God has placed in our lives.We thank God that when there are endings, there are new beginnings too, throughout the season of life.We thank God for being with us every day of the year, for all that we've gone through, the good along with the hard times. We thank God for the experiences that have brought us to this moment, wiser and stronger, loving life ever more. We thank God for the work of others that gives breadth and depth to our own work.

We ask the Lord to lead and direct us through the new challenges; opening doors needing to be opened and closing the ones needing to be shut. May we stay open to the moment as best as we can. May we welcome God's lavish love and his plan for us in the New Year we have just begun.

LEADER: Let us invoke the Holy Spirit as we prepare our hearts to listen to the Word of God.

SCRIPTURE READING: 1Thes 5:12-18

REFLECTION: 'Be joyful always', Paul advises. It's not easy to be joyful, never mind 'always', and here he adds 'give thanks in all circumstances'. This sounds like a tall order. I think he's trying to draw a distinction between Christians and everyone else. Others may be joyful because of circumstances on particular occasions, but Christians can feel the joy of Christ's loving sacrifice and support for them, and that's something which doesn't change

- It doesn't depend on circumstances. Imagine you have to write down a reason to be joyful in your life. On the other side of the paper write down all the obstacles to joy that you face. This is rather like the newsreader who, before he began to read out a serious news story, thought of a positive event each time. Some people can't rejoice because the world is full of suffering, and, if you feel like that, then it shows you're a sensitive person, and it's good to have a heart of flesh rather than a heart of stone, but Paul tells you to rejoice because of faith.

(Brief moments of silent reflection and examination of life in the light of the gospel and the reflection)
