Introduction:

Jesus promised us a peace that "the world cannot give and the world cannot take it away". (Jn 14:27). This peace is born within our hearts and is reflected in a right relationship with God and with our fellow beings. The current pervasive impact of violence and war, the perennial conflict in our world resulting in huge loss of innocent lives overwhelm us and also poses a big threat to the future of human family. Pope Francis rightly observed, "In a world where everything speeds by, only the end to war seems slow," He says, "Our greatest and yet most fragile treasure is our shared humanity as brothers and sisters, children of God. None of us can be saved alone." The lack of peace in human hearts takes its manifestations in conflicts, turmoil and hate. Hence, we need to fervently pray and work for peace within our own hearts and in the world. The peace of God allows us to look at each other and at God's entire creation through heaven's eyes of dignified beauty and love. As a faith community gathered at the feet of our Eucharistic Lord, let us pray for the reign of God's peace everywhere.

Leader:

Therefore we invoke the Holy Spirit before we listen to God's Word.

Scripture Reading: Romans 12:15-20

Reflection:

"If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone." There are situations where achieving peace may be challenging or even impossible. Emphasis on "if it is possible" reminds us that we should always strive for peace, even in the face of difficulty. The verse goes on to say, as far as it depends on you, which places the responsibility for promoting peace squarely on each individual. It urges us to take proactive steps in our attitudes and actions to create and maintain peace in our relationships and interactions with others. "Live at peace with everyone," is a call for universal peace. The believers are urged to relinquish the desire for revenge and instead trust in God's justice. The passage emphasizes that vengeance is not the prerogative of humans but God's. It encourages Christians to have faith in divine justice and to let go of their anger and desire for retribution. When we develop a lifestyle of making the Lord our refuge, we begin to live in the peace of God. Pope Francis said, "Peace is a special gift of God and this gift needs to be ceaselessly implored in prayer and welcomed it with commitment every day, in whatever situation we are in. "Do you not get on with a certain person? Make peace!"; "At home? Make peace!" "At your place of work? Make peace!" Work for peace, for reconciliation and fraternity. These small gestures are of so much value: they can be seeds which give hope, they can open paths and perspectives of peace"
