Hymn: No. 123. – Father we love you, we worship and adore you - (Joyful Celebration Hymnal)

(*Pause... for Moments of Silent and Personal Adoration before the Eucharistic Lord*) **Introduction:**

For your constancy; that even when everything changes for good or for worse, you always remain the same faithful, unconditional in love and true to your promises. \mathbf{R} -

Leader: The Holy Spirit acts as a spiritual teacher, helping believers grasp the deeper meaning, apply Biblical principles to our lives and grow in our faith fostering a close relationship with God and a deeper understanding of his Divine plan. Therefore we invoke the Holy Spirit before we listen to God's Word.

Scripture Reading: 2Cor 5:17-20

Reflection:

St Paul paints for us a beautiful picture of the transformative power of Christ's redemption. Through Christ, we become a new creation – a profound, spiritual rebirth that marks the end of our old ways and the beginning of a life rooted in the love and grace of God. The past no longer defines us; instead, we find our identity in Christ, who offers us a fresh start. Furthermore, He emphasizes the ministry of reconciliation that God has entrusted to us. We are called to be ambassadors of Christ, representing the very heart of God's mission in the world. Just as God, through Christ, reconciled us to Himself, we are now given the task of carrying this message of reconciliation to others. As ambassadors of reconciliation, we are invited to extend the same grace and forgiveness that we have received to those around us. In a world marked by division, strife, and brokenness, our role as ambassadors is crucial. We are called to embody the love of Christ, not counting the sins of others against them but pointing them toward the reconciling embrace of our Heavenly Father. May our lives be a testament to the transformative power of God's love, and may we, with urgency and humility, implore those around us to be reconciled to God.

For the Sick and Suffering: Lord, we lift up to you all those who are suffering, whether in body, mind, or spirit. Grant them strength in their afflictions and surround them with the healing power of your love. **R**/

For the Departed: We remember with love and gratitude those who have gone before us. May they find eternal rest in your presence, and may the memories of their lives inspire us to live with purpose and kindness. \mathbf{R}/\mathbf{I}

Lord, as we embark on this New Year, we place our hopes and fears, joys and sorrows, into your loving hands. Walk with us, guide us, and fill our hearts with the light of your presence.
