For our parish community: That the grace of Christ's birth may renew our faith and strengthen our commitment to walk in His light. *We pray to the Lord.*

Celebrant: God our Father, on this day you reveal your love in the birth of your Son, the true Light who has come into the world. Hear the prayers we bring with faith. We ask this through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**
