#### Celebrant:

**For our parish community:** That we may carry the light of Christ from this holy night into our daily lives and for the faithful departed: That they may awake to the fullness of Christ's eternal light. *We pray to the Lord.*

#### Celebrant:

Lord God, in the silence of this holy night, Your Son Jesus was born for us. Hear the prayers we bring with faith, and fill our hearts with the light of His presence. May His love guide our steps and His peace dwell in our homes. We ask this through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**
