Introduction

Our Liturgy today reminds us that having Jesus in our boat does not exempt us from life's storms, but it does guarantee our ultimate safety. As we celebrate Care of Creation Sunday, this year's theme is "Living Water", that offers a two-fold invitation. It draws our attention to the importance of water in our lives and also calling us to draw nearer to Jesus who offers us Living Water. Just as water is essential for physical life, our spiritual life needs God's presence and grace to survive and flourish.

- Let us pause to pray for our personal and local needs in the silence of our hearts. We pray to the Lord.
